Mr. Rogan added that the concern was the actual site plan, not necessarily the stores, Mr. Ten Kate explained it is only for the work outside of the footprint such as the parking lot, only the outside work, which the Borough Attorney added has essentially been completed.

APPRAISAL SYSTEMS, INC., an appraisal firm with its office located at 266 Harristown Road, Suite 302, Glen Rock, NJ 07452 hereinafter referred to as the Firm.

#### WITNESSETH:

Whereas, the Municipality is engaged in a program to annually re-assess all the lands, buildings and improvements contained within the boundaries of the Municipality and has engaged the services of the Firm to render necessary advice and assistance in the said project; and

Whereas, the Firm will assist the Borough Tax Assessor to complete an annual reassessment as prescribed by law (N.J.S.A. 54:1-35.35); and

Whereas, the Bergen County Board of Taxation and the Director of the Division of Taxation, State of New Jersey have granted approval for a re-assessment program set to begin October 1, 2017 to be effective for the tax year 2018;

The municipality agrees to pay the sum of NINETY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$95,000.00) for the first year then FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000) per year for years two through Six.

Now, therefore, each of the parties hereto intending to be legally bound hereby, it is agreed as follows:

The re-assessment program will begin as of October 1, 2017 to be effective for the tax year 2018 and continue as of October 1, 2018 to be effective for the tax year 2019; October 1, 2019 to be effective for the tax year 2020; October 1, 2020 to be effective for the tax year 2021; October 1, 2021 to be effective for the tax year 2022 and October 1, 2022 to be effective for tax year 2023.

The total amount paid as of January 10, 2023 will be THREE HUNDRED FORTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS(\$345,000).

The annual reassessment program will be conducted in accordance with the requirements of the State outline for reassessment programs as outlined in the attached standard Application for Reassessment form (AFR).

# ARTICLE 1 ANNUAL REASSESSMENT PROCEDURES

- A. The Real Property Appraisal Manual for New Jersey Assessors will be utilized to develop appropriate depreciated replacement costs for all improvements as of the assessing date.
- B. All exempt property assessments will be updated to a current value as of the assessment date.
- C. All land assessments will be updated to a current value as of the assessment date utilizing generally acceptable land valuation procedures.
- D. A land value map shall be developed using appropriate land unit values such as front foot, effective front foot, excess front foot, square foot, acreage value and base or minimum site value.
- E. Sales of all properties deemed to be usable and occurring within the past three years will be analyzed; and significant data extracted from appropriate sales will be utilized in developing pertinent factors, adjustments, tables and/or schedules for determining current market values of property as of the assessment date.
- F. All owners of income-producing property will be requested to submit income and expense information as provided under N.J.S.A. 54:4-34
- G. 100% of properties will be inspected in the first year then 20% will be inspected in years two through six so that over that five year period 100% of the properties will be inspected.
- H. All applicable approaches to value will be employed in the valuation process, and values developed will be reconciled to determine a final assessed value of the property as of October 1 of the pretax year.
- The Firm will notify all taxpayers of their proposed assessment and will be available to conduct taxpayer hearings.
- J. The Firm shall assist by providing an expert witness in the defense of all valuations rendered to the Municipality that are appealed to the Bergen County Board of Taxation.

# ARTICLE II CONTRACT CONTINGENT UPON APPROVAL BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF TAXATION

- A. This contract is contingent upon approval of the Director of the Division of Taxation and shall not be effective until such approval is noted on the approval page provided within this Agreement.

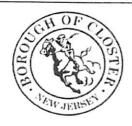

#### REVIEW AND DISCUSSION OF COMMUNICATION ITEMS 4.

MAIL LIST OF MARCH 23, 2017 – Mayor Glidden asked if any member of the Council wished to address any matter or provide any comments. Item No. 1 was removed by Councilman Barad; Item No. 13 was removed by the Borough Clerk.

Item No. 1: Received 03/17/17, Dated 03/10/17 from Holly T. Schepisi, Assemblywoman, 39th Legislative District re Copies of Introduced Assembly Bills A-4666, that imposes a moratorium on all affordable housing litigation until the end of the year, and A-4667, creating a short term commission that will study prior court decisions, the effectiveness of past affordable housing practices, and analyze projected population increases; with enclosed sample resolution of support for both bills (Distributed to Mayor and Council, Attorney, Administrator via e-mail on 3/20/17)

Councilman Barad voiced his support for this Resolution and suggested the governing body pass same. Mayor Glidden recalled this Resolution was adopted at the last meeting and said it is very interesting because the history of COAH goes back to the 80's. It has always been a problem but now we are getting suggestions that our obligation is to build 480 units of affordable housing which is ridiculous for a town of our size. We believe the process, which is being run by the courts and no longer a committee of professionals is not being run properly so that is the purpose of the Bill drafted by Assemblywoman Schepisi to create a moratorium and create a committee of professionals to address the housing obligation.

Councilman Barad asked if anyone had any comments about the Equalization Table; and the Mayor said he would speak to the Borough Administrator about it.

Councilwoman Latner voiced her recollection that she has never seen something like this before where someone is requesting reimbursement. Mayor Glidden informed he was speaking with the Borough Attorney regarding same; and there have been incidents in the past where the Borough has reimbursed someone; and usually it comes after the report of a pothole or something of that nature. This is the first he's heard about it; and he thinks it should be mentioned to the DPW. In answer to Mrs. Latner the Borough Attorney advised the location is a County road; and he suggested responding by telling the author the road is under the purview of the County and to contact them. Councilman Barad questioned why the County paved the Alpine portion of the road but not Closter's portion. He suggested inquiring same of the County.

Mayor Glidden informed the approvals for the parade are being coordinated and asked everyone to mark Monday, May  $29^{th}$ , for the parade.

At this time, Mayor Glidden wanted to remind that the Earth Fair will be held on April  $22^{nd}$  from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Tenakill School and urged all to attend.

Councilwoman Latner informed the newsletter contained information about the Future Municipal Leaders Scholarship and informed the Mayor and Leslie Weatherly reviewed the three submissions we received; and one was chosen to be submitted for the scholarship. Mayor Glidden reminded one of our submissions was chosen about two years ago.

<u>Item No. 5:</u> Received 04/04/17, Dated 04/04/17 from Councilman David Barad to Loretta Castano re Forwarded (unapproved) copy of Recreation Commission meeting minutes from 3/20/17 re discussion of signs for drone regulation (Copy to Jim Oettinger)

Councilman Barad informed there is some suggested wording for rules; and his suggestion is that the rules are stipulated in accordance with the rules promulgated by the Recreation Commission, otherwise, he has no objections to some of the rules they are looking to put into place. Councilman Yammarino spoke to Jim Oettinger; and he wanted them to know the Recreation Commission will not finalize anything before the Mayor and Council sees it. Dr. Barad reiterated he wanted it on the record that he feels more comfortable with the language that the rules are by order of the Recreation Commission in regards to the parks; but said something like this approaches what we need.

d. <u>MAIL LIST OF APRIL 13, 2017</u> – Borough Clerk informed the following items were added at the request of the Mayor and Borough Attorney and would appear on the upcoming Mail List.

Mayor Glidden informed the first two items (1a and 1b) were received from the Bergen County Historic Preservation Advisory Board informing our Borough Hall has been selected to receive a 2017 Bergen County Historic Preservation Award in the "Restoration Project" category; and that the Closter Plaza "Dancing Diamonds" and Edens have been selected to receive a 2017 Bergen County Historic Preservation Award in the "Continuing Preservation or Use" category. There will be a presentation on May 4<sup>th</sup> at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Englewood and he will be attending same.

Borough Attorney informed Item No. 6 pertaining to COAH was sent to the COAH Committee and explained that South Brunswick has been involved in intense litigation with Fair Housing and they are basically requesting funds from other towns. They've spent on one motion alone \$25,000 and they anticipate another \$15,000 on the next. So far on COAH litigation they estimate they've spent over \$500,000. They are one of the first towns who have been in process and they are essentially saying they paved the way for other towns. South Brunswick received a negative decision from Judge Wolfson which they have been appealing back and forth and they are going after him pretty hard in the appeal papers saying there are conflicts and he has business interests. Mr. Rogan has not seen a Judge being attacked so harshly before in appeal papers. He noted that southern New Jersey is much farther ahead in terms of their COAH litigation and the process; and he finds it interesting to see how much they have spent on it to date. This will appear on the next Mail List so everyone can read further details. In response to the Mayor, the Borough Attorney advised against making a monetary contribution to South Brunswick for their litigation efforts.

Mayor Glidden noted Item No. 20 requires a 2/3 majority vote of the Governing body and would be voted on separately in the Regular Meeting. Councilwoman Chung referred to Item No. 35.

8. In answer to Councilwoman Chung, Borough Attorney advised that performance bonds are posted for the development; and the Borough Engineer and Building Department have reviewed the project and found that the bulk of the project has been completed. Therefore, the bond does not have to be as big as it is and part of it can be given back at the request of the developer. Mr. DeNicola wrote a letter recommending the reduction inasmuch as he is comfortable with same. Mayor Glidden explained a performance bond guarantees completion of a project.

Borough Attorney voiced his opinion there should be some discussion on these items prior to passing the Resolutions.

27. RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE HIRING OF JOHN L. PETERS AS CONSTRUCTION CODE OFFICIAL (Requested by Borough Attorney 4/5/17) - TO BE PREPARED BY BOROUGH ATTORNEY

Mayor Glidden said that this is a 4-year appointment and the agreement calls for \$40 per hour for a 35 hour week and would also include the appointment of Acting Zoning Officer as Mr. Peters is qualified for both positions. He would also be available to attend Planning and Zoning Board meetings at no additional charge. The appointment as Acting Zoning Officer would provide us with time for an additional search for other candidates.

28. RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE HIRING OF JOHN L. PETERS AS ACTING ZONING OFFICER (Requested by Borough Attorney 4/5/17) - TO BE PREPARED BY BOROUGH ATTORNEY

In answer to Councilwoman Chung, Borough Attorney said the Zoning Officer is not as heavily regulated as the Construction Code Official and 90 days would be the standard of appointing an acting Zoning Official, therefore giving the Borough the opportunity to review the appointment. This is an annual appointment whereas the Construction Code Official is a 4-year term; and upon reappointment, the individual would receive tenure barring some incident. The acting appointment of the Zoning Official is for up to 90 days. Borough Attorney said that action on the Acting Zoning Officer must be taken this evening because if an application is filed tomorrow, the Borough has only 10 days to act upon it. Councilman Barad expressed his support for the appointments.

Councilwoman Chung commended the Fire Department on their recruiting efforts.

#### 6. PROFESSIONAL REPORTS

### A. BOROUGH ATTORNEY

- 1) STATUS REPORT RE CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE OF MULTIPLE CONDOMINIUM UNITS AT VILLAGE SCHOOL SITE (RM 11/24/14) Borough Attorney informed there have been a number of developments since the last meeting. He requested a Closed Session for discussion on same and Council discussion and decisions on a number of other issues.
- 2) REPORT Mr. Rogan advised there have been some discussions regarding the DPW Teamsters contract; and asked to update same in Closed Session. In terms of COAH litigation, he informed there is a conference scheduled before Judge Toskos on 4/20/17; he hopes our immunity will be extended as it runs out at the end of April; and he is hoping for a trial date to be set. Mr. Rogan informed the COAH Committee met and made some decisions and recommendation that he will discuss in Closed Session. Some of those things pertain to having the Planning Board review and have public hearings before any recommendations are made back to the full Council. Hopefully, after next Thursday, he will have a better idea of a firm timeline for potential ordinance changes and strategies.

Borough Attorney informed he wanted to discuss generally some items that have been coming up; in particular, the way the Borough is awarding contracts. He explained there are two ways to do a contract aside from bidding; "Fair and Open" and "Non-Fair and Open". He recalled 5 or 6 years ago, possibly more, that the Borough had a Resolution that it would be their policy to do Fair and Open Resolutions and contracts. He said there is nothing wrong legally by doing a Non-Fair and Open contract, and sometimes for expediency, it is easier to do it that way; but he wanted to revisit the policy at this time because the last several agendas have had numerous Non-Fair and Open items on them. He thinks the Council should revisit same and discuss again their preference for contract awards. In answer to Councilwoman Latner, he explained there does not have to be a choice but there should be some type of policy. Mr. Rogan prepared something that he will distribute by e-mail with the pros and cons for the Fair and Open process versus Non-Fair and Open. Fair and Open requires some type of notice to the public for at least 10 days and can be put on the Borough website; and calls for Request for Proposals; and the Mayor and Council can take what comes in and make a decision. Non-Fair and Open can be done by quotes; and somebody in the Borough can just pick three people and get quotes, write it up and just have it appear on an agenda. That process is more paperwork for the staff because they have to get all of the political disclosure forms and somebody has to be following up that the individual not only has not contributed over \$300 up to the time of the contract but also that they do not make any more contributions over the term of the contract. If it is a 2 or 3 year contract and that person had donated \$300 in the time prior to the award of the contract, they cannot contribute any more for the next 2 or 3 years or the term of the contract; and somebody has to be tracking that; there is an administrative process that has to be watched. Under Fair and Open, they can have contributed \$300 and can continue to contribute pursuant to our ordinance as they can contribute \$300 per year. He provided a summary and would like the Council to review same and either reiterate their Fair and Open policy or make the change that they would like to switch to Non Fair and Open. Mr. Rogan said a couple of the Resolutions this evening were slowed down because we passed the Fair and Open Resolutions and they were attempted to be awarded as Non Fair and Open, so they were pulled. He wants to clear up the confusion because it is easier to some extent for an employee to just say they're going to make three phone calls and then make an award that way. The former Administrator had done it previously but he was also the QPA (Qualified Purchasing Agent). Now we have to coordinate an outside QPA and our Administrator; and he believes everybody needs to be on the same page, whichever page that is.

Councilman Barad recalled that at one of his first meetings, he had noted he did not understand why we would want to award something that is not fair and open; and he doesn't like the name. Borough Attorney agreed that although it may sound bad, it is legal. He voiced concern that there needs to be more coordination as more tracking is involved; there are several different people preparing resolutions and one said "Fair and Open" which it really wasn't. The ones he was concerned about were pulled; and they are on the agenda this evening as Non-Fair and Open. Someone questioned why we were doing Non Fair and Open resolutions and he wants to clarify same. Dr. Barad voiced his opinion that it may be easier to make some phone calls but said it causes a lot of problems. Borough Attorney advised he would distribute the packet for review and discussion; and he urged the need for a Resolution to clarify the policy. He said absent some time restraint, it is the better policy to use Fair and Open for transparency.

from AMEC Foster Wheeler for the risk analysis and they are awaiting the Council's decision. In response to the Mayor, he reminded it was dated 8/3/15 in the amount of \$16,210. The Mayor explained this is necessary in order to proceed with the grant we applied for to clean up the property; and he proposes approving the payment at the next meeting. Borough Clerk voiced her recollection that Mr. DeNicola wanted to get updated pricing which is why same has not yet been passed. Mr. Ten Kate said he would speak with him regarding same; and Borough Attorney advised the Resolution would reflect any updated number. In answer to Councilwoman Chung, the Mayor affirmed the grant is for site remediation, which is approximately \$1M and that is a very broad estimate. He reminded the grant would cover 75% of the cost of the remediation, the Borough would cover 25% and we would have to keep it as a recreational facility, which we would like to keep as an indoor pool. Mr. Ten Kate voiced his understanding that this qualifies as part of the remediation if we have the assessment done.

Mrs. Amitai said she believes the Environmental Commission supported the idea and the Borough Attorney voiced his understanding it was more on the Conservation Zone and Buzzoni Farm.

Steve Isaacson, Environmental Commission Member, informed the Commission wanted to propose naming the Conservation Easement Trail for Dr. Arthur Goldberg and naming the Buzzoni Tract for former Mayor, Sophie Heymann. Mr. Rogan recalled that Dr. Goldberg was instrumental in making sure the conservation easement was created on both sides of the driveway and behind the area between Piermont Road and Temple Emanu-El. Mayor Glidden asked for any comments and no objections were voiced to same. Therefore, he requested a Resolution be prepared for the next meeting.

#### B. BOROUGH CLERK

- 1) REPORT RE 2017 APPOINTMENTS Borough Clerk reported outstanding appointments are currently being maintained on the Agenda.
- 2) STATUS REPORT RE 2017 OATHS OF OFFICE Ms. Castano was pleased to report 98% of the Oaths of Office have been returned.
- 3) STATUS REPORT RE 2017 LICENSES Borough Clerk reported Borough Licenses are current.

Regarding Liquor Licenses, Ms. Castano explained we have received a completed application for the Person-to-Person Transfer of Plenary Retail Distribution License held by A&P which will be placed on the Regular Meeting Agenda for 4/26/17. It has been a long journey, everyone has cooperated and it has been a learning experience. In answer to the Mayor, Borough Clerk informed at this time there is no pending application for a Place-to-Place Transfer for this license.

Ms. Castano reported we received an almost completed application for the Person-to-Person and Place-to-Place Transfer of Plenary Retail Consumption License held by Harvest which is awaiting the completion of the investigatory portion from the Police Department and receipt of reports from Borough Officials. She informed that the process takes longer because the applicant has to produce certain paperwork for the investigatory portion requiring review and approval; and the longer it takes for the information to be provided, the longer it takes for approval to be obtained.

- 4) STATUS REPORT RE 2017 MEETING DATES Ms. Castano reported meeting dates are current.
- 5) STATUS REPORT RE CODIFICATION OF 2016 ORDINANCES Borough Clerk reported this is in progress as we received word on April 5, 2017 that shipment of Supplement No. 23 will take place by the end of next week.
  - 6) REPORT RE ELECTIONS Ms. Castano reported the following:
- a. PREPARATIONS FOR PRIMARY ELECTION TO BE HELD 6/7/17 from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. Office of Governor, 40 members of the State Senate from each of the 40 Legislative Districts; 30 members of the General Assembly, two from each of the 40 Legislative Districts, two members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders. The last day to file petitions for Municipal Office was Monday April 3, 2017, by 4 p.m. Prior to that date she received Petition for the Democratic Party and the Republican Party, checked the petition and signatures and prepared the Election copy indicating the following nominations: Republican Party slogan: Bergen County Republican Organization Candidates: incumbents David H. Barad and Robert A. Di Dio; Democratic Party slogan: Democratic Committee of Bergen County Candidates: Scott M. Devlin and Dolores A. Witko. She certified same and sent it to the Bergen County Clerk Elections Division on 4/4/17.
- 7) REPORT Ms. Castano informed as follow up to her previous report on 3/8/17, she forwarded the League of Municipalities article on OPMA and Group E-mails to the Borough Attorney for information and follow through; and noted that A-4429/S-2855, which would permit publication of legal notices on websites instead of newspapers, is being stalled in the Legislature.

Upon her return from vacation she received a letter from the Board of Elections asking for dates to hold a review meeting preferably in Borough Hall prior to the Primary Election due to the difficulties being

evidenced at the last election by the Board Workers. Thursday, May 4, 2017 was chosen for the meeting to be held in the Council Chambers as had been done in the past. They will arrive at 5 p.m. to set up the voting machines and the class will be held from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. Ms. Castano will follow through as she had in the past (2011) to obtain a certificate of insurance and hold harmless agreement from the Board of Elections for approval at the next Regular Meeting to be held 4/26/17. This is a hands-on review; and the Board Workers will be better prepared for the Primary Election.

### C. CHIEF OF POLICE

1) REPORT – Chief Kaine reported the Monthly Report was emailed on Friday and invited any questions or comments. The Department participated in mandatory active shooting training yesterday with Haworth P.D. and Tenakill School; and tomorrow they will be at Temple Beth El doing room sweeps with Haworth P.D. He informed this is Prosecutor mandated training for 1 hour per year. In answer to Councilwoman Amitai, the Chief informed they are doing joint training with Haworth because, in the event of a real incident, they would be the first additional responding department.

Chief Kaine reported they are participating in the "U Drive. U Text. U Pay." detail with \$5,500 grant funding from the State. They will do 4 hour details and the reports will be filed with the State. He explained it is an overtime detail from the State to enforce safety during peak traffic times. In answer to Councilwoman Chung, he explained fines for cellphone use or texting while driving is at the discretion of the Judge using a min-max and how many other violations a person has had.

The Chief informed they will be participating in the DEA's Operation Takeback for unused and expired drugs on Saturday, April 29<sup>th</sup>, at the Police Garage from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Also, they will be participating with the PTO for bike safety on the same day at Hillside School. The Department is working with the Library, as the Seniors didn't want it at their building, a program from Triple A (AAA) for Seniors on properly and safely adjusting their vehicles. Councilwoman Latner said the Library is a good location with the parking lot right there.

#### D. MAYOR

1) REPORT – Mayor Glidden informed he had no report but informed there were several items he wished to discuss in Closed Session.

Steve Isaacson, 97 Columbus Avenue, asked for an update on the repair of the railroad crossing at Closter Dock Road; and Mayor Glidden said the DPW can do the repairs. Mr. Isaacson referred to the lack of garbage collection on Good Friday; and questioned if this could be included in future negotiations. He referred to recycling pickup during months with five Wednesdays and asked that recycling be rescheduled in the future to every other week. He referred to the History Day being celebrated in Harrington Park and suggested that Closter do the same. He said the Borough held a History Walk at one time and maybe this could be coordinated with the schools. Councilman Yammarino said he would address this with the

Historic Preservation Commission. Mr. Isaacson suggested a Community Center with an indoor pool during the discussion on the Swim Club. Mayor Glidden said if the Borough gets the grant, it has to be maintained as a recreational center. Mr. Isaacson said the building could also be used for senior citizen activities and classrooms. Councilwoman Latner said that use would be ideal and an indoor pool could be used for the high school.

Mr. Isaacson referred to the Northern Valley Earth Fair on April 22<sup>nd</sup> from 11a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Tenakill Middle School and noted that most of the Fair would be outdoors and in the gym. He thanked the schools, the Mayor and Council, Borough Administrator, Leslie Weatherly, Police Department and Bill Dahle for their help. He said there will be live entertainment, petting zoo, food vendors and educational forums. There would also be soil testing for lead.

Councilwoman Amitai noted that at the Planning Board Meeting there was a discussion of the road repair done by utility companies; and it was suggested by former Mayor Heymann that an ordinance be adopted to mandate that the road repair be done from curb to curb not just the area disturbed by the utility work. Councilman Barad noted that the area sinks and the Borough Engineer said that the material used for backfill must be compacted and given time to settle. He said a number of towns are going to a curb to curb repair or as a minimum to half the road. He said we could look at ordinances from other towns and discuss same with the Council. The standard for utility paving is two years but there is a problem getting the utility to return to fix the repair and it requires diligence.

Councilwoman Amitai said the Parking Authority met regarding Third Street and commuter parking and guesstimated the cost to be \$50,000 to pave, do lighting and create a walkway at the edge of the driveway going west towards Piermont Road. She explained the proposed location of the parking area. She suggested doing the sidewalk to see if the residents actually use the parking lot before investing the rest of the money for paving. Councilman Barad expressed support for the sidewalk and the remainder of the Council expressed support. Borough Attorney to provide a resolution. Councilman Barad noted that the paving would require different funding.
