REGULAR MEETING MINUTES - WEDNESDAY, JUNE 23, 2021 - 7:30 P.M.

The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Closter held a Regular Meeting on Wednesday, June 23, 2021.

Mayor Glidden called the meeting to order at 7:34 p.m. and informed he would read Item Nos. 13, 14 and 15 into the record and ask for a vote:

Mayor Glidden asked for a Motion of approval of Resolution Nos. 13, 14 and 15.

Motion approving Resolution Nos. 13, 14 and 15 was made by Councilwoman Latner, seconded by Councilwoman Chung and declared carried by Mayor Glidden upon the affirmative vote of Councilpersons Devlin, Latner, Witko, Yammarino, Chung and Amitai.

Mayor Glidden said in the 15 years he has been on the Council he has not seen so many Officers attend a swearing in ceremony. The Mayor Congratulated the Department on their comradery and excellence.

Police Commissioner Latner introduced Austin Willock and read his biography: Austin Willock is a current resident of Ridgefield Park, New Jersey, but grew up in Woodcliff Lake. He attended Pascack Hills High School where he played football and ran track. He then went on to Rowan University, where he earned a Bachelor's Degree in Law and Justice with a minor in Psychology. While at Rowan, he was Vice President and Sergeant at Arms for his fraternity Tau Kappa Epsilon and maintained a 3.5 GPA to remain on the Dean's List for the entirety of his education. He was drawn to law enforcement at a young age being very close and looking up to the officers of his hometown, Woodcliff Lake. His desire to pursue a career in law enforcement was enhanced after taking classes in high school and at Rowan University. Austin wants to make a difference in the town of Closter and help make its residents feel safe, while striving to serve as a role model for youth. He is eager to begin and is honored to be accepted into the Closter Police Department.

Police Commissioner Latner introduced Shayne Bohus and read her biography: Shayna Bohus is a resident of Park Ridge, New Jersey. She attended Rutgers University – Newark where she majored in Criminal Justice with a minor in Spanish. She also played four years of soccer at Rutgers while being a Police Reserve for Park Ridge, and worked at Life Time Fitness. She has pursued a career in law enforcement because of her innate ability and willingness to protect people with a team player mentality. She is eager to be the first female officer to have the privilege to be mentored by the Closter Police Department and looks forward to serving the community of Closter.

Police Commissioner Latner introduced Tae Han and read his biography: Tae Han is a Korean-American immigrant. He was and is a resident of Bergen County, New Jersey since emigrating from South Korea in 2003. He attended Cliffside Park High School where he played three years of varsity soccer and was part of the State Championship Team during his senior year in 2011. He subsequently enlisted and served four years and six months in the United States Marine Corps, where he repaired, maintained, and managed various military weapons and systems as a Small Arms Repair Technician. Before honorably separated from the military, Tae got married to a beautiful woman and had a son together. Upon separation from the Marine Corps, Tae returned to Rutgers University - Newark where he earned a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice in 2020. He has long envied men and women in uniform, doing greater things to better our society. Since childhood, his dream of becoming a member of Law Enforcement has helped pave his path to a successful and responsible man. His father, a former South Korean Marine, and as well as his brother in the United States Army, helped concentrate his vision as supported the path in which Tae needed to take to be better prepared for the challenge of Law Enforcement. He wishes to be a proud husband, father and man and he hopes to have a positive impact on the Borough of Closter and its community, and he truly believes that he will achieve his goals knowing he is in good care of the officers above him.

Councilman Devlin wished to comment on the background of this ordinance prior to a vote for Introduction and Borough Attorney affirmed he could do so.

Councilman Devlin explained this ordinance represents the agreement by the Mayor's Landscape Noise Committee and restricts construction and landscaping on Sundays and holidays. It also reduces the hours by one hour on Saturdays.

Miriam Lockhart, 55 Everett Street, voiced her sentiments that some residents came before the Council regarding quality of life issues due to landscapers and not being able to enjoy the outdoors. She also noticed at her own home, she often has to move indoors to have a conversation because of the noise. Our neighboring towns have less time to operate. She said the changes being proposed here are very small and in line with our neighboring municipalities. She thinks the changes are a win-win for everyone and feels this change still supports the professionals whose services are used to provide for their own families.

Mark Lupardi, 707 Blanch Avenue, Norwood, doesn't feel this is doing any justice. He informed there were only five (5) complaints about landscapers since January; and one of those was in the winter. He reminded that landscapers don't have the luxury of climate controlled offices or set hours – the ordinance affects everyone in town; not just the few that brought this issue up. He would like to make sure it is written properly because emergencies and snow plowing are contracted – if someone complains at 10 p.m. in a storm the police would have to act. He thinks inclement weather should be built into this ordinance and feels this should be thought out more.

Councilwoman Amitai explained the reason they did it this way was to try and simplify it. She voiced her agreement with Mr. Lupardi that maybe in inclement weather it does become a hardship and there should be a clause included. Mayor Glidden said we are only introducing this ordinance and we have time to address to the concerns.

Councilman Devlin explained this ordinance would allow the Building Department to issue fines or summonses to the company cutting the trees instead of the homeowner. He expressed his feeling that they are the professionals and should know the rules.

Borough Attorney clarified that this is in addition to fining the homeowner – it allows us to do both. He said it would be primarily the tree cutter, but homeowner would ultimately be responsible if the tree cutter did not pay the fines. Councilman Devlin said the first attempt will be to sanction the tree company to reduce number of appeals from homeowners; the tree companies are the ones who have the experts and should be aware of the regulations.

RESOLUTION CONDEMNING THE RISE OF ANTI-SEMITISM

WHEREAS, in 2010, the United States Department of State adopted the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance's "Working Definition" of Anti Semitism that states: "Anti Semitism is a certain perception of Jews, which may be expressed as hatred toward Jews. Rhetorical and physical manifestations of Anti Semitism are directed toward Jewish or Non-Jewish individuals and/or their property, toward Jewish Community institutions and religious facilities"; and

WHEREAS, the Department of State outlines the following contemporary examples:

- "Calling for, aiding, or justifying the killing or harming of Jews, (often in the name of radical ideology or an extremist view of religion);
- Making mendacious, dehumanizing, demoralizing, or stereotypical allegations
 about Jews as such or the power of Jews as a collective especially but not
 exclusively, the myth about a world Jewish conspiracy or of Jews controlling the
 media, economy, government or other societal institutions;
- Accusing Jews as a people of being responsible for real or imagined wrongdoing committed by a single Jewish person or group, the State of Israel, or even for acts committed by non-Jews;
- Accusing the Jews as a people, or Israel as a State, of inventing or exaggerating the Holocaust;
- Accusing Jewish citizens of being more loyal to Israel, or to the alleged priorities
 of Jews Worldwide, then the interests of their own nations; and

WHEREAS, severe recent incidents of Anti-Semitism have occurred in and around New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Attorney General's Office 2020 Bias Incident Report reported 298 Anti-Jewish Bias Incidences across New Jersey in 2020, which accounts for 76% of reported incidents motivated by the victims religion; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Closter finds that these hateful acts are detrimental to fostering safe and harmonious communities; and

WHEREAS, residents of the Borough of Closter have a rich history of being tolerant to all faiths and religions; and

WHEREAS, an attack on one faith or religion is an attack on all,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Closter hereby denounces and unequivocally condemns all forms of Anti-Semitism and hateful acts against any religion or ethnic group; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Closter rejects attempts to justify Anti-Jewish hatred or violent attacks as an acceptable expression of disapproval or frustration; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Closter will never tolerate acts of this kind and stand in solidarity with all victims of hatred and united against expressions of Anti-Semitism.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council hereby authorize the following:

- 1. The Borough of Closter Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and issue estimated tax bills for the Borough for the third installment of 2021 taxes. The Tax Collector shall proceed and take such actions as are permitted and required by L. 1994, c.72 (N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.2 and 54.4-66.3).
- 2. The estimated calendar year tax levy for 2021 is hereby calculated at \$52,199,271.00.

The maximum amount that the Borough will utilize in the preparation of the 2021estimated tax bills is less than 105% of the 2020 calendar year tax levy.

3. In accordance with New Jersey Statutes, the third installment of 2021 taxes shall not be subject to interest until the later of August 10th or the twenty-fifth calendar day after the date the estimated tax bills were mailed.
