RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING VOICE VOTE TO CONTINUE INDOOR MASK MANDATE IN PUBLIC AREAS OF PUBLIC BUILDINGS IN THE BOROUGH OF CLOSTER THROUGH JUNE 23, 2021

WHEREAS, due to the public health emergency caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, Governor Murphy issued a series of Executive Orders and mandates intended to combat the spread of the pandemic, which included a mandate that individuals in indoor and outdoor settings wear face masks/face coverings with limited exceptions, and practice social distancing; and

WHEREAS, because of the progress that has been made in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic in New Jersey, as well as the widespread availability of vaccines, in recent months the Governor announced a series of reopening steps over the course of several months, including increasing the indoor and outdoor gathering limits, and, more recently, easing the mask mandate and social distancing requirements in certain settings and under certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, on May 17, 2021, Governor Murphy issued Executive Order No. 241, which lifted the statewide mask mandate in outdoor public spaces but retained masking requirements in indoor spaces; and

WHEREAS, since the issuance of Executive Order 241, the State has determined that it can also lift social distancing requirements in indoor and outdoor settings in light of new CDC guidance and progress that has been made on both COVID-19 metrics and vaccine administration; and

WHEREAS, on May 24, 2021, Governor Murphy issued Executive Order 242, which lifted the State's mask mandate in indoor public spaces effective May 28, 2021, regardless of individuals' ability to maintain six feet of distance from other individuals or groups, but also cautioned that individuals who are not fully vaccinated should continue to wear masks in indoor public spaces in accordance with CDC recommendations; and

WHEREAS, although New Jersey continues to vaccinate large numbers of individuals each day, Executive Order 242 acknowledges that it is still appropriate to maintain mitigation protocols in certain settings to ensure COVID-19 spread is limited while dissemination of the vaccine continues; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 242 recognizes that there is considerable variation in vaccination rates among different localities, and for that reason explicitly acknowledges that it is appropriate to allow counties and municipalities to retain an indoor mask mandate if they so choose; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 242 makes clear that employers and entities overseeing public spaces in settings where masking is no longer required pursuant to the provisions of Executive Order 242 are permitted to impose stricter requirements regarding mask-wearing in indoor settings for employees, customers, guests, and other individuals, where otherwise consistent with federal and State law; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the CDC also has noted that decisions about indoor mask mandates should be made at the local level; and

WHEREAS, at its Public Meeting on May 26, 2021, the Governing Body of the Borough of Closter determined that it would be prudent and in the public interest to proceed cautiously in eliminating the indoor mask mandate in public areas of public buildings, and a voice vote was taken to require individuals to continue to wear face masks/face coverings in public areas of public buildings through June 23, 2021, at which time the indoor mask mandate issue will be re-visited by the Governing Body;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Closter, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, that this memorializes the aforementioned voice vote by the Governing Body to require individuals to continue to wear face masks/face coverings in public areas of public buildings in the Borough of Closter through June 23, 2021, at which time the indoor mask mandate issue will be revisited by the Governing Body.

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE STAGGERING OF ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION TERMS TO CORRECT MEMBERSHIP EXPIRATION DATES

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 16-2 of the Borough of Closter Code, the Borough's Environmental Commission consists of seven members appointed by the Mayor to three-year terms, one of whom shall be a member of the Planning Board and one of whom shall be a member of the Council; and

WHEREAS, when the Environmental Commission was first created, the Code initially provided for an initial one-year term for two members, two-year term for two members, and three-year term for three members for the purpose of creating staggered terms so that the terms of at least two but not more than three members shall expire in any one year; and

WHEREAS, due to some vacancies in recent years, several of the recent appointments to the Environmental Commission inadvertently were made for terms that do not align with the Code's framework for staggered terms; and

WHEREAS, while two of seven members of the Environmental Commission, Sophie Heymann and Miriam Lockhart, were appointed in 2019 to three-year terms that expire on December 31, 2021, the remaining five members of the Commission – Thomas Colwell (Chairman), Modi Feibish, Steve Isaacson, Krishna Rege, and Councilman Scott Devlin – were all appointed earlier this year to 3-year terms that expire on December 31, 2023; and

WHEREAS, in order to restore the Borough Code's framework for staggered terms, two of the five 3-year appointments made to the Environmental Commission earlier this year must be modified to provide for a term that expires on December 31, 2022, to ensure that the terms of at least two and not more than three members shall expire in any one year; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor shall determine the respective terms of office which shall be modified to expire on December 31, 2022, solely for the purpose of restoring the staggered terms provided for under the Borough Code as set forth above;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Closter, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, hereby affirms that the appointments to the Environmental Commission shall be corrected to reflect staggered terms as set forth in the Borough Code, and expresses its support for modifications to the terms of any existing members as the Mayor deems necessary to ensure compliance with Article 16 of the Borough Code.


