GRANTEE AUTHORIZING RESOLUTION 2022 COUNTY OF BERGEN FOOD SECURITY TASK FORCE SUSTAINABILITY GRANT

WHEREAS, during the March 9, 2022 meeting of the Mayor and Council, the governing body discussed the Closter Food & Assistance Board's need for refrigeration and freezer space for the purposes of safely and securely perishable food supplies for distribution to its clients on a monthly basis; and

WHEREAS, the County of Bergen's Food Safety Task Force (FSTF) established the Food Security Task Force Sustainability Grant Program to assist local Bergen County emergency food providers and meal distributors with critical equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Closter Food & Assistance Board made application to the Bergen County FSTF for purposes of obtaining grant funding for the purpose of obtaining the refrigerator and freezer needed to meet the safety requirements for perishable food supplies; and

WHEREAS, the Closter Food & Assistant Board grant application was for a Reach-in Refrigerator, (\$3,181.61) and Reach-in Freezer (\$4,160.72) to replace the non-useable equipment that is located in the Closter Senior Center building; and

WHEREAS, the County of Bergen FSTF awarded a total grant amount of \$8,020.00 to the Closter Food & Assistance Board for the purpose of purchasing the Reach-in Refrigerator and Reach-in Freezer which shall be paid in a single lump sum within 10 business days of the receipt of a fully signed Contract; and

BE IT RESOLVED, the Mayor and Council hereby acknowledged that the use of this grant toward this approved purchase of a Reach-In Refrigerator and Reach-In Freezer must be completed within 6 (six) months of its receipt of award by Grantee; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the governing body of the Borough of Closter is committed to supporting the food distribution efforts provided by the Closter Food & Assistance Board and authorized Mayor John C. Glidden to be a signatory to the aforesaid grant agreement contract, which will be memorialized by Resolution at the regularly scheduled meeting of March 23, 2022 and a copy will be forwarded to the Bergen County Food Security Task Force (FSTF).

**BERGEN COUNTY FOOD SECURITY TASK FORCE SUSTAINABILITY
GRANT AGREEMENT**

This Agreement made this 1st day of March, 2022 by and between the County of Bergen (hereinafter "County"), a body politic and corporate of the State of New Jersey, located at One Bergen County Plaza, Hackensack, New Jersey 07601-7076, and Food & Assistance Board of Closter (hereinafter "Grantee"), a Municipality of the State of New Jersey, located at 295 Old Closter Dock Road, Closter, New Jersey, 07624.

WHEREAS, in July 2020, the County established the Bergen County Food Security Task Force, (hereinafter "Task Force") comprised of members of the Bergen County Administration, the Bergen County Board of County Commissioners and local Bergen County Non-Profit Organizations, as a response to the unprecedented levels of food insecurity affecting many of the communities located in the County of Bergen; and

WHEREAS, the County has allocated certain American Rescue Plan Federal Funding (hereinafter "Funding") to the Task Force to be utilized towards the food insecurity needs of the residents of Bergen County; and

WHEREAS, the Task Force has allocated the Funding to be used for the investment in building, maintaining or upgrading the existing infrastructure of the extensive food pantry and emergency food distribution network run in Bergen County by qualifying non-profits, civic, faith-based and/or local government agencies; and

WHEREAS, in order to accomplish the above, the Task Force has established the County of Bergen Food Security Task Force Sustainability Grant Program with the following goals in mind: 1. Assist local Bergen County emergency food providers and meal distributors with critical infrastructure investments at their operations site to ensure their program's sustainability. 2. Seek to enable emergency food providers in Bergen County to increase refrigeration or freezer capacity to offer fresh food items to their client population. 3. Provide improved technological solutions or fill technological gaps to assist local Bergen County emergency food providers with better ability to track inventory needs, maintain client information, and conduct consistent marketing and outreach into their local communities. 4. Sponsor local emergency food provider efforts to either develop much-needed social service programs for their client population at their agency site or provide direct information and navigation for how to obtain critical services.; and

WHEREAS, the Grantee has made an application to the County for financial assistance in accordance with the County of Bergen Food Security Task Force Sustainability Grant Program guidelines and said application and the Project Description contained therein are attached and incorporated into this Agreement as Attachment A; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 147-22, passed on March 1, 2022, the Bergen County Board of County Commissioners has agreed to a grant award in the amount of \$8,020 (hereinafter "Grant Award") to the Grantee in accordance with the terms set forth in the Resolution as well as the terms and conditions set forth herein,. Said Resolution is attached hereto as Attachment B and incorporated herein.

WITNESSETH

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties intending to memorialize the terms and conditions of the aforesaid grant, do hereby enter into the within Agreement effective as of the date and year first written above.

- I. **Purpose of Grant.** The Grant Award will be used by Grantee solely for the Grant Purpose as set forth in Attachment C (hereinafter "Grant Purpose"). Grant funds may not be expended for any other purpose. Grantee will repay any portion of the Grant that is not used for the Grant Purpose. Grantee may not expend any Grant funds to induce any violation of law or public policy, to cause any private inurement or improper private benefit to occur.
 - II. **Expenditure of Funds.** Grantee must expend the Grant Award and have all work completed and/or all property purchased in the possession of Grantee within six (6) months of its receipt by Grantee. Within fourteen (14) days of the total expenditure of the Grant Award by Grantee, but under no circumstances later than six (6) months after the Grant Award's receipt by Grantee, Grantee shall provide to the County all evidence of said expenditure, including, but not limited to receipts, canceled checks, credit card bills, photographs, contracts and warranties or guaranties. Failure to timely spend the Grant Award, in full or otherwise, or to timely provide the required proofs to the County shall result in the Grantee having to immediately repay any portion of the Grant that is not used for the Grant Purpose to the County and/or that amount of the Grant Award for which no sufficient proof evidencing an approved expenditure is timely provided to the County.
 - III. **Extension of Six Month Expenditure Period.** In the event that, through no fault of the Grantee and for reasons that could not be avoided, Grantee is unable to expend the Grant
-

Award and have all the work completed and/or all property purchased in the possession of Grantee (i.e. the Grant Purpose) within six (6) months of the receipt of the Grant Award by Grantee, Grantee may request a reasonable extension by submitting the same in writing, setting forth the length of the extension sought and the reasons for the delay. Any extension request must be received by the County within six (6) months of the Grantee's receipt of the Grant Award. The County shall be under no obligation to grant a requested extension and shall be entitled to in its sole discretion, refuse or allow the same for any reason, or for no reason at all.

- IV. **Ownership of Property.** Any tangible or intangible property obtained or created by or on behalf of Grantee with Grant funds, including patents and copyrights, will belong to Grantee, unless the parties otherwise agree in writing, signed by both parties. Materials created by or on behalf of Grantee with Grant funds will, where appropriate, include acknowledgement that the materials and related project were funded in part by a grant from the County. Notwithstanding the above, in the event that the Grantee shall, within five (5) years of receiving the Grant Award, be dissolved or close its Bergen County location the Grantee hereby agrees to, at the County's option, transfer, for no cost, any property obtained or created by or on behalf of Grantee with Grant funds to the County.
 - V. **Restrictions on the Transfer of Property.** The Grantee agrees, in perpetuity, not to lease, sell, exchange or donate the Property obtained or created by or on behalf of Grantee with Grant funds without the written approval of the County.
 - VI. **Records and Reports.** Grantee will maintain records of receipts and expenditures with respect to all Grant funds and will make its books and records with respect to the Grant available to the County and its representatives at reasonable times. Grantee will provide any other documents, materials, and information reasonably requested by the County or its representatives. Grantee will keep the financial records with respect to the Grant, along with copies of any reports submitted to the County, for at least five years following expenditure of the Grant funds.
 - VII. **Reasonable Access for Evaluation.** Grantee will permit the County and its representatives, at the County's request, to have reasonable access during regular business hours to Grantee's files, records, accounts, personnel and clients, or other beneficiaries for the purpose of making such financial audits, verifications, or program evaluations as the County and its representatives deem necessary or appropriate concerning the Grant.
-

- VIII. **Publicity.** Grantee will allow the County to review and approve the text of any proposed publicity concerning the Grant prior to its release. The County may include information regarding the Grant, including the amount and purpose thereof, any photographs Grantee may have provided to the County, Grantee's logo or trademark, or other information or materials about Grantee, in internal and external communications, including but not limited to, the County's public reports, outreach materials, advertisements, newsletters, flyers, brochures, press releases, on the County's Web site and as may otherwise be required by law.
- IX. **Indemnification.** Grantee agrees to indemnify the County and the Task Force against any loss or expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees) the County incurs as a consequence of breach by Grantee of any of its undertakings hereunder. In addition, by accepting the Grant, Grantee irrevocably and unconditionally agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the County and the Task Force and each of its officers, directors, employees, and agents, from and against any and all claims, liabilities, losses, and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) directly or indirectly, wholly or partially, arising from or in connection with any act or omission of Grantee or its employees or agents, in applying for or accepting the Grant, in expending or applying the Grant funds, or in carrying out the program to be funded by the Grant, except to the extent that such claims, liabilities, losses, or expenses are solely due solely to the negligence of the indemnified party.
- X. **Right to Modify or Revoke.** In addition to the County's rights with respect to disbursement of Grant funds under any other provision of this Agreement, the County reserves the right to discontinue, modify, or withhold any disbursement of Grant funds or to require a total or partial refund of any Grant funds if, in the County's sole discretion, such action is necessary: (a) because Grantee has not fully complied with the terms and conditions of the Grant or this Agreement; (b) to protect the purpose and objectives of the Grant or any other social welfare interest of the County; or (c) to comply with the requirements of any law or regulation applicable to Grantee, the County, or the Grant.
- XI. **Miscellaneous.**
- (a) **Acceptance.** Grantee hereby accepts the Grant subject to all of the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.
- (b) **Capacity.** The individual signing this Agreement on behalf of Grantee hereby certifies that: (a) he or she is a duly elected and authorized officer of Grantee; and (b) he or she is authorized to accept the Grant on behalf of Grantee and to obligate Grantee to observe all of the terms and conditions placed on the Grant, and in connection with the Grant, to make,
-

execute, and deliver on behalf of the Grantee this Agreement and all representations, receipts, reports, and other instruments of every kind.

(c) **Assignment**. Grantee may not assign or otherwise transfer its rights or delegate any of its obligations under this Agreement and any purported assignment or delegation will be of no effect.

(d) **No Continuing Waiver**. Neither party will be deemed to have waived any rights under this Agreement unless such waiver is in writing and signed by such party. The waiver by any party of any breach of this Agreement will not operate or be construed to be a waiver of any subsequent breach.

(e) **Entire Agreement; Amendments**. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the County and Grantee regarding the Grant and supersedes any and all prior negotiations, understandings, or agreements in regard thereto. Attachments A, B, and C are incorporated by reference herein and made a part of this Agreement. This Agreement may only be amended or modified by a written instrument signed by both parties.

(f) **No Agency or Partnership**. Nothing in this Agreement will be construed to create any relationship of agency, employment, partnership, or joint venture between the parties, and Grantee will make no contrary representation to anyone.

(g) **Binding Agreement**. This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto, their successors, heirs, executors, administrators and assigns.

(h) **Governing Law**. This Agreement will be construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey, without regard to conflicts-of-laws principles.

(i) **Severability**. If any provision in this Agreement proves to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement will not be affected thereby.


(j) **Counterparts**. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which will be considered an original. To facilitate execution, this Agreement may be executed through the use of facsimile transmission.

(k) **Contractors**. Grantee shall be responsible to ensure that all Contractors hired by the Grantee or contracted with to perform, in whole or in part, the Grant Purpose performs such work in the normal course of its business and is properly licensed and insured and that all required permits and inspections are performed.

It is the municipality's responsibility to bill and collect from these industrial users their charges as a source of municipal revenue to offset the 2022 Sewer Service Charge. According to the service agreement, if all or any part of any payment from a municipality shall remain unpaid for thirty days following its due date, the municipality shall be charged with and pay to the Authority interest in the amount unpaid from its due date until paid at the rate of eight percent (8%) per annum.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN

AND TEAMSTERS UNION LOCAL NO. 125

It is hereby agreed by and between the Negotiations Committee of the Borough of Closter (the "Borough") and Negotiations Committee of Teamsters Union Local No. 125 (the "Union") as follows:

1. The provisions of this Memorandum of Understanding are subject to ratification by the respective parties to the contract.
2. The signatories below agree to recommend this Memorandum of Understanding for ratification by their respective constituencies.
3. A copy of this Memorandum has been furnished to representatives of the Employer and the Union.
4. All proposals not covered herein made by either party during the course of negotiations have been deemed withdrawn.
5. All provisions of the prior Agreement shall be carried forward except as hereinafter provided.
6. Unless otherwise notified, all dates involving the duration of the Agreement shall be conformed to the duration of this proposed negotiated Memorandum of Understanding.
7. Article VI (Salaries) – A 2.25% per annum across the board salary increase effective as of January 1, 2021, in each year of the contract.
8. Article VIII (Regular Work Hours-Overtime and Standby Pay) – A \$5.00 per day increase in standby pay effective on the first day of the month following execution of a successor agreement.
9. Article XI (Replacement of Tools) – A \$100.00 per year increase effective as of January 1, 2022. The replacement of tools allowance shall be applicable to both the Mechanic and the Mechanics Helper.
10. Article XV (Insurance) – Section C shall be deleted in its entirety.

11. Article XXII (Miscellaneous Provisions) – Section A shall be modified to provide for an annual allowance, inclusive of eyeglass care, in the amount of \$1,140.00.
12. Appendix A – The existing Agreement regarding the “Assistant DPW Superintendent” shall be added to the Salary Schedule. The position of “Mechanics Helper” shall be added to the Salary Schedule on the same basis as the compensation afforded to “Buildings and Grounds”.
13. Article XXIV (Duration of Agreement) – A six (6) year agreement effective as of January 1, 2021 and expiring on December 31, 2026.

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE PEOPLE OF UKRAINE AND THEIR SOVEREIGNTY

WHEREAS, on January 21, 1990, more than 300,000 Ukrainians formed a human chain between Kyiv and Ivano-Frankivsk in an effort to bring forth unity and independence from the Soviet Union; and

WHEREAS, on December 1, 1991, a national referendum in support of independence was voted upon by more than 90 percent of Ukrainian citizens, with majorities in every region; and

WHEREAS, subsequent thereto, in October 2021, the Russian military conducted an even larger military backup that culminated in approximately 190,000 forces by the time of Russia's renewed full-scale incursion on February 24, 2022; and

WHEREAS, on February 24, 2022, Russian forces, enabled by Belarus, launched its unprovoked full-scale renewed invasion of the peaceful, independent country of Ukraine; and

WHEREAS, it is the right of all countries to decide its own future, foreign policy and security arrangements free from outside interference and/or coercion; and

WHEREAS, also on February 24, 2022, the G7 issued a statement condemning the "large-scale military aggression by the Russian Federation against the territorial integrity, sovereignty and independence of Ukraine"; and

WHEREAS, on February 25, 2022, the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) condemned "in the strongest possible terms Russia's horrifying attack on Ukraine", called on Russia "to turn back from the path of violence and aggression" and reaffirmed an "iron-clad" commitment to Article 5; and

WHEREAS, the European Commission, France, Germany, Italy, the United Kingdom and Canada, along with the United States, committed to coordinated economic sanctions, including severe restrictions against Russia's Central Bank and full blocking sanctions against Vladimir Putin; and

WHEREAS, United States leadership is integral to nations around the world in condemning and imposing costs on the Russian Federation for its illegal, full-scale, renewed invasion of Ukraine; and

WHEREAS, it has been reported that Russian forces have targeted civilians which would constitute war crimes and crimes against humanity; and

WHEREAS, the United States, along with allies in Europe, the Indo-Pacific and others around the world, has been actively responding to Russia's unprovoked war of aggression against Ukraine with critical military, humanitarian and financial support for Ukraine and the Ukrainian people; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has numerous residents of Ukrainian decent, some of whom are located in the Borough of Closter and neighboring communities; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the residents of the Borough to support the people of Ukraine in protecting their sovereignty.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Closter that it:

- Unequivocally supports Ukraine’s sovereignty and territorial integrity;
- Affirms the continued use of peaceful methods including sanctions by the United States (as well as its allies and partners) to fully isolate the Putin regime economically for its unprovoked aggression against Ukraine;
- Supports the resistance by the Ukrainian people as long as the Russian Federation continues to violate Ukraine’s sovereignty and territorial integrity;
- Declares that the war in Ukraine, a democratic country, represents the frontline of democracy and freedom versus authoritarianism represented by Putin’s government;
- Supports the State of New Jersey’s suspension of relationships with businesses and financial institutions backed by the Russian government; and
- Stands steadfastly, staunchly, proudly and fervently behind the Ukrainian people in their fight against the authoritarian Putin regime; and


