VI. Old Business

- a) NJUCF Tree Inventory Grant
 - Chairman Abate asked three vendors to review the RFP. Vendors to communicate with Borough Administrator.

- c) 317 Haring Street Homeowner appealed tree fine at M&C meeting. Tree removal vendor will be penalized.
- d) Canopy loss in Closter
 - i.Tree fines/appeals. Borough Attorney researching moving tree appeals from Mayor and Council to Municipal Court.
 - ii.Tree meeting on 2.25.22 to review and improve tree permitting and enforcement. Attended by Building Dept., Police Dept., Borough Administrator, members of Shade Tree and Environmental Commissions. CPD will stop tree removals on weekends if permit is not posted. \$100,000 in tree fines still pending. Mitigation will be discussed at March tree meeting.

Chairman Abate will set up Arbor Day festivities with principals at Tenakill and Hillside Schools. RFQ submitted for 2 trees: a red maple and a white oak to plant at the schools. Mr. Bradbury requested that Chairman Abate ask the principals whether the schools can be responsible for watering the trees.

c) 12 Haring Street - unauthorized street tree removal

The homeowner will not be fined because the tree was hollow and therefore needed to be removed. Mr. Paschalis will draft a letter to the homeowner informing that removal of street trees must go through proper channels in the future.
