## The Closter Public Library

The Closter Public Library, located at 280 High Street in Closter offers an array of guest speakers, children's programs, a comprehensive young adult library and the Belskie Museum Gallery wall. Additionally, your library card provides free access reserve passes for the Intrepid Museum (one ticket admits six people), and the Guggenheim Museum (one ticket admits four people); Rosetta Stone – learn a language at home, and E-Sources (downloadable books and magazines - ZINIO), streaming music. New books and audio books are available the day of release by the publisher. With all of these additional benefits available to library card holders, your library card is worth more than a\$1,000/year!

#### **Closter Police Department**

The Closter Police Department is reminding all of us New Jersey State law states all motorists MUST stop for pedestrians in a marked crosswalk. Failure to observe the law may subject the driver to one or more of the following – two points, \$200 fine (plus court costs), insurance surcharges or 15 days community service. The Police Department is also reminding our residents that under New Jersey State law, it is illegal for a person under age 21 to purchase, consume or possess an alcoholic beverage. Please help us to keep Closter's residents and visitors safe!

#### **Closter Senior Citizens' Club**

Closter's Senior Citizens' Club is an active organization, holding bi-monthly meetings on the first and third (1st and 3rd) Wednesdays of every month at the Senior Center located behind the Closter Borough Hall. In addition to the bi-monthly social meetings, the Senior Club offers Bingo and light exercise classes. The Borough offers a variety of opportunities to our senior residents including support of trips, guest speakers and entertainment. Through the Closter Police Department senior residents can benefit from a daily call-in program referred to as "Operation Concern". Our police officers provide information on topics such as scams, robbery and ID theft as well as conduct scheduled DEA collections for the safe disposal of unused medications. The Borough's Health Department offers blood pressure screenings on the first Wednesday of the month at both the Closter Senior Club meeting and at the Closter Public Library.
