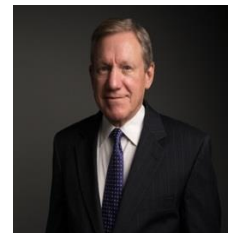

The Closter Police Department is requesting all members of the community to exercise measures that will assist in deterring thefts of property and vehicles. *Lock all vehicles, remove the valuables from vehicles and remove the key fobs. Through the efforts of Dr. Arthur Goldberg, former Borough Historian, a plaque and map of the road is on view at the Norwood Borough Hall. Norwood shares this roadway with Closter.
