## Bergen County Emergency Rental & Utility Assistance Program

The County of Bergen is providing financial relief to eligible Bergen County residents who experienced a financial hardship during the COVID-19 pandemic. Tenants who have been unable to pay their rent and/or utility payments since March 2020 are encouraged to apply for funding. # **Senior Van Transportation Service**

The Borough of Closter offers a joint service for Senior Van Transportation to Closter residents who are non-driving seniors in need of transportation to medical appointments, grocery stores, senior activities and more within a ten mile radius of Closter. Together with Haworth and Harrington Park, the shared service program is helping to meet the needs of our residents. Medical appointments take preference during scheduling of transportation, and patience is asked as you may need to arrive early to an appointment or wait for the van to return to pick you up. The service consists of trained and caring individuals who work to meet the needs of the participants.

To participate in this programs, persons must be seniors who are non-drivers (or temporarily unable to drive), independent to walk to the vehicle and depart the vehicle unassisted and who are flexible in the pick-up, drop-off times for medical appointments. The Senior Van service operates Monday through Friday between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Reservations must be made 48 hours in advance.

### Closter Environment Commission Event at Buzzoni Farm

Closter residents are invited to join the members of the Closter Environmental Commission on Saturday, July  $10^{th}$  (rain date July  $11^{th}$ ) as the Commission holds an event at the Buzzoni Farm Park on Blanch Avenue. The program begins at 3:00 p.m. with a dedication of the north-south trail which runs from the Buzzoni Farm Park through the Conservation easement terminating at Ruckman Park in memory of Dr. Arthur Goldberg, an environmentalist and historian. Following the trail dedication at 3:30 p.m., residents are invited to explore and learn about the pollinator garden, while young children will be invited to paint birdhouses and listen to farm stories. The Buzzoni Farm Park is located on Blanche Avenue. The event is limited to Closter residents.

### **Closter's Shade Tree Commission**

The Closter Shade Tree Commission is one of the Borough's boards and commissions designed to oversee and enhance the quality of life we all enjoy. The STC has an opening for a resident to serve as a member of the commission. The commission is comprised of up to nine appointed residents who serve as the custodians of the shade trees along or roadways. The goal of the commission is to maintain the health and diversity of

our tree resources. The commission provides educational events to Closter's students at the annual Arbor Day celebrations. Projects can include planting, pruning, inspection and protection of all shade trees. To

serve on the commission, candidates must be Closter residents who are 18 years of age or older. No prior experience is necessary and fellow commission member will help train new members. The Commission meets on the second Monday of every month at 8:00 p.m. (except August).

A message from Vincent McHale, Superintendent of Closter Public Schools

"Congratulations to the Closter students, parents, teachers, administrators, staff and Board of Education for their determination, perseverance and dedication throughout the entire year. It was a challenging journey but the students received instruction safely. The school year was filled with lots of learning this year as teachers learned new ways to deliver instruction and teachers and students learned new technologies. The Closter Public Schools are now a stronger school community as a result of all that has been learned. The fourth grade moving-on ceremony and eighth grade graduation took place at Memorial Field on Wednesday, June 16, 2021 and the Board of Education extended gratitude to the Mayor and Council for granting permission to use the field. Over 200 students are participating in summer programs – learning never stops in Closter Public Schools! Schools will reopen on September 2, 2021 for the new school year and will be offered only in-person using a full day schedule".

#### Juneteenth

Juneteenth, June 19, 1865 was declared a federal holiday earlier this month. Juneteenth has officially been added to Closter's calendar as a federal holiday. During the June 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the Mayor and Council, the governing body voted unanimously to recognize and add Juneteenth to the Borough's calendar.

With the decline in Covid related cases and the availability of vaccines, Closter will be reopening its public buildings on July 6<sup>th</sup>. Masks are required in *all* public areas of *all* public buildings and social distancing in group meetings is encouraged.
