Join us for the 2021 Clean- Up Closter event on Saturday, April 24, 2021 between 10:00am and 2:00pm. This year there are three meeting locations: the historic Lustron House (421 Durie Ave), the Closter Nature Center (154 Ruckman Rd), and the front lawn of the Closter Senior Center (4 Lewis St). The rain date is May 1<sup>st</sup>.

Supplies for the clean-up will be provided; you only need to bring yourself! Safety protocol requires all participants to wear a mask/ face covering and maintain social distancing. Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult. This is a terrific way for students to count these hours toward community service. As the weather warms, take this opportunity to spend a beautiful day outside, meet new people and help "spring clean" and keep Closter the clean, green borough we all enjoy.

#### **Closter Shade Tree Commission**

Happy spring! Look for many of the Borough's ornamental cherry, pear and native serviceberry trees to bloom early in the season. Our latest trees, those planted this past fall, have begun to establish themselves and would benefit greatly from caring neighbors. The most important thing you can do is to water the tree. About 15-20 gallons of water, once a week in dry weather, between May and October (it's only 3-4 large buckets). Removing weeds from around the base of the tree will also help, as they steal much-needed nutrients and water. Replenishing the mulch around the tree helps suppress weeds, regulate soil temperature and adds nutrients. Use 2-3 inches of mulch in a "doughnut" shape, without touching the trunk of the tree.

What not to do??? Please, do *NOT* prune the tree! Borough experts will attend to that when the time is right. For more information, please contact the STC at <a href="mailto:shadetree@closter.us">shadetree@closter.us</a>.

On Thursday, April 1<sup>st</sup>, the Closter Volunteer Fire Department eagerly welcomed the arrival of its new Pierce Enforcer Special Operations Air Unit Truck, Unit 765. Emergency Support Unit 765 includes: Enforcer Chassis, Cummins L9 450hp Engine, Pierce Command Zone, Onan 25kW Generator, Akron 8000 valves, Whelen Lighting, Seating Capacity for 8 (eight) and Custom Tool Mounting and Fabrication by Fire and Safety. The Enforcer Special Operations Air Unit Truck will service the needs of the community by providing air support during rescue operations and all of the necessary equipment the R.I.T. (Rapid Intervention Team) needs when responding to our community's calls for service.



The Borough of Closter is moving forward in many positive directions. Volunteers are the backbone of any community, and I encourage each of you to think of ways in which you can, as a volunteer, make a difference.
